



## YACHT INFORMATION SHEET

<b>Location:</b> Kos (Greece)	<b>Voltage:</b> 220v (50Hz) electrical outlets are available on board for hairdryers, electric shavers etc. A converter or adaptor is recommended if your appliance is not compatible with European sockets (2 round pin type).

<b>Nearest airport:</b> Kos airport, 22 km.	<b>Visa requirements:</b> Visitors from many countries, including citizens of the EU, will not need to obtain a visa for visits up to 90 days. Please check with your travel agent before travelling.
<b>On arrival:</b> Arrivals at the airport between 13.00 and 15.00 will be able to take advantage of a complimentary pick-up service that will take guests into Kos town. Luggage will be taken directly to the yacht while guests should make their way to the marina in time to board at 18.00. It is a very pleasant 15-20 minute walk or a short taxi ride. Guests arriving on later flights should make their own way to the yacht, with taxis from the airport providing the best option. You will be sailing on either Romy or Nicodemus, identical catamarans belonging to the Yacht Club fleet.	<b>All-inclusive fee:</b> The non-refundable mandatory all-inclusive package price of £510* per person is payable at least two months prior to arrival. Included are all meals (with the exception of two dinners which are taken ashore), all drinks whilst on board, cruising permits, fuel, crew, water, port charges, sports and onboard activities and facilities. *The all-inclusive charge per person will be adjusted annually to reflect the increases in costs of food, drink, labour, port charges and generally the cost of providing facilities on board.
<b>Yacht facilities:</b> Air conditioned saloon with fully equipped galley and fully-stocked bar (including cocktail blender and ice maker), lounging area, chart table with navigation, plasma screen and DVD player. Dining area. Cockpit with outdoor dining area and lounging seats. Hammocks and outdoor freshwater shower on deck. Stereo with indoor and outdoor speakers.	<b>Other useful information:</b> -You will be asked to complete a check-in form when you arrive. If you arrive earlier than the specified check-in time you may leave your luggage at the yacht and do some sightseeing or simply relax until boarding. Kos offers opportunities for sightseeing and shopping. The first evening will be spent at the port (so do not worry if you arrive late), having welcome cocktails followed by dinner on board and a chance to get to know your crew and fellow passengers. The yacht will leave the marina on Thursday morning after breakfast. Most days there will be a morning and afternoon sail with a stop for lunch in between, and plenty of opportunities for water activities, sunbathing, exploring the islands and coastline and shopping throughout the day. Each evening we will anchor in one of the many bays. On Tuesday night we will return to the marina for dinner ashore at one of the many wonderful restaurants. The crew will arrange your taxi to the airport on Wednesday morning. -There is an age limit of 16 years unless all four cabins on the yacht have been booked for the same party or you have arranged for the yacht to be shared with other families with children. -High factor sunscreen is essential (please refrain from using the spray form and scented oil as it mars the boat and can cause slipping). -Bed linen, bath and beach towels are supplied and will be changed once during the week. -Smoking is only permitted on deck and is not allowed in the cabins or saloon areas. -Library, board games and cards available on board. -The waters we sail in are generally calm and guests rarely experience seasickness. You may, of course, bring some form of prevention with you, although tablets will be available on board if needed.
<b>Cabin amenities:</b> Air conditioning, storage space, private shower and electric toilet.	<b>Please note: you will be required to complete personal details and sign a liability form at check-in.</b>
<b>Water activities:</b> Equipment is provided for water activities: scuba diving, snorkelling, sea kayaking, wakeboarding, water skiing, sea biscuit, fishing, water mattresses and windsurfing. Scuba diving is only permitted on presentation of full certification and insurance, and a £30 charge per dive will be made to non-Yacht Club Members (payable in local currency, exchange rates may vary according to date of payment). Wetsuits can be rented from a local dive shop - alternatively, guests are welcome to bring their own equipment if preferred.	<b>Have you booked your flights? <b>Clothing:</b> The Aegean Sea enjoys a pleasant year-round climate so for most of the sailing season lightweight casual clothes, beachwear and a jumper or light jacket for evenings are ideal. In the shoulder months of April and October, evenings and early mornings can be fresh so mid-weight clothing is more suited. Please pack clothes in soft bags and as far as possible keep luggage to a minimum.	
<b>Footwear:</b> <b>Concerning what shoes to wear while on the Yacht, it is important that you have the proper footwear in order to ensure safety and keep the boat ship-shape. If you have regular boat or deck shoes, these are ideal. However, if you do not, trainers or sports shoes are welcome so long as they are non-marking (no dark soles), have been cleaned prior to being used on board and are only used on board. Barring these options, you will have to get around the boat either in socks or barefoot.</b>
