On arrival:	<p>From the airport, there will be a complimentary pick-up service to take you directly to the yacht at the marina.</p> <p>Guests should go to the meeting point between gates C and D, which is identified by a large yellow sign at ceiling level with an arrow pointing to the meeting area. Our CLC Yacht Club representative will be there to greet you. For guests returning to the airport there is a taxi rank directly outside the marina. Cost is in the region of 20€ one-way.</p>	All-inclusive fee:	<p>The non-refundable mandatory all-inclusive package price of £450* per person is payable at least two months prior to arrival. Included are all meals (with the exception of two dinners which are taken ashore), all drinks whilst on board, cruising permits, fuel, crew, water, port charges, sports and onboard activities and facilities.</p> <p>*The all-inclusive charge per person will be adjusted annually to reflect the increases in costs of food, drink, labour, port charges and generally the cost of providing facilities on board.</p>
Yacht facilities:	Air conditioned saloon with fully equipped galley and fully-stocked bar (including cocktail blender and ice maker), lounging area, chart table with navigation, plasma screen and DVD player. Dining area. Cockpit with outdoor dining area and lounging seats. Hammocks and outdoor freshwater shower on deck. Stereo with indoor and outdoor speakers.	Other useful information:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – You will be asked to complete a check-in form when you arrive. If you arrive earlier than the specified check-in time you may leave your luggage at the yacht and do some sightseeing or simply relax until boarding. Palma offers endless opportunities for sightseeing and shopping. The first evening will be spent at the port (so do not worry if you arrive late), having welcome cocktails followed by dinner on board and a chance to get to know your crew and fellow passengers. The yacht will leave the marina on Sunday morning after breakfast. Most days there will be a morning and afternoon sail with a stop for lunch in-between, and plenty of opportunities for water activities, sunbathing, exploring the islands and shopping throughout the day. Each evening we will anchor in one of the many bays around the island. On Friday night we will return to the marina for dinner ashore at one of the many wonderful restaurants. The crew will arrange your taxi to the airport on Saturday morning. – There is an age limit of 16 years, unless all four cabins on the yacht have been booked for the same party or you have arranged for the yacht to be shared with other families with children. – High factor sunscreen is essential (please refrain from using the spray form and scented oil as it mars the boat and can cause slipping). – Bed linen, bath and beach towels are supplied and will be changed once during the week. – Smoking is only permitted on deck and is not allowed in the cabins or saloon areas. – Library, board games and cards available on board. – The waters we sail in are generally calm and guests rarely experience seasickness. You may, of course, bring some form of prevention with you, although tablets will be available on board if needed.
Cabin amenities:	Air conditioning, storage space, private shower and electric toilet.	– Please note: you will be required to complete personal details and sign a liability form at check-in.	
Water activities:	<p>Equipment is provided for water activities: scuba diving, snorkelling, sea kayaking, wakeboarding, water skiing, sea biscuit, fishing, water mattresses and windsurfing.</p> <p>Scuba diving is only permitted on presentation of full certification and insurance, and a £30 charge per dive will be made to non-Yacht Club Members (payable in local currency, exchange rates may vary according to date of payment). Wetsuits can be rented from a local dive shop - alternatively, guests are welcome to bring their own equipment if preferred.</p>	Have you booked your flights? Clothing:	The Mediterranean enjoys a pleasant year-round climate so for most of the sailing season lightweight casual clothes, beachwear and a jumper or light jacket for evenings are ideal. In the shoulder months of April and October, evenings and early mornings can be fresh so mid-weight clothing is more suited. Please pack clothes in soft bags and as far as possible keep luggage to a minimum.		
Footwear:	Concerning what shoes to wear while on the Yacht, it is important that you have the proper footwear in order to ensure safety and keep the boat ship-shape. If you have regular boat or deck shoes, these are ideal. However, if you do not, trainers or sports shoes are welcome so long as they are non-marking (no dark soles), have been cleaned prior to being used on board and are only used on board. Barring these options, you will have to get around the boat either in socks or barefoot.
